Being able to organize the Winter Concert was a novel experience I will not forget. As a concert director, my partner (Meggie) and I were responsible for choosing the songs, sending updates to the performers, communicating with the facility, and presenting the opening and closing statement. Our first task was to choose the songs. At first, it was difficult to handpick pieces that were at an appropriate level for the entire group and matched the holiday theme, but we managed to find 8 wonderful selections with the input and guidance of Mr. Grant. My personal favorite is a Million Dreams from the Greatest Showman. Although it is not exactly a holiday piece, the melody is heartfelt, inspiring, and grand - a perfect medley to perform during a time of celebration. While Meggie was in charge of communicating with the facility, I was tasked with sending out regular updates about the concert and rehearsals to the members. It took patience and consistency to be able to pump out these emails all while I was juggling school and extracurriculars, especially as the updates I needed to send became more frequent when December rolled around. Oftentimes, I would need to draft emails during the middle of the week when I was swamped with schoolwork. Lastly, a critical part of our role as concert directors was presenting the opening and closing statement in front of our audience. I had experience presenting in front of a big group before, but it's nerve wrecking each time. Meggie and I needed to come up with statements that were concise yet welcoming to the audience. By concise, I meant that our statements were no longer than 45 seconds. Both statements went by quickly, but each time the audience applauded with warmth. When we left the concert, we were both proud of the work we had accomplished in planning a meaningful event that would hopefully kick off a wonderful holiday season for both the performers and the audience.


Our conductor, mentor and friend.
